

In 2021, the U.S. faced critical blood supply shortages. Multiple factors related to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic contributed to this shortage, including blood drive cancellations due to illness and staffing limitations. But staff at Southwest Medical Center took it upon themselves to try to combat this issue. Our hospital and the Red Cross joined forces to host multiple blood drives throughout the year. Employees at Southwest Medical Center were asked to roll up their sleeves and do their part to help with this crisis.



"American Red Cross to this day is still facing a national blood crisis - it's the worst blood shortage in over a decade, posing a concerning risk to patient care. Blood donations are critically needed to help prevent further delays in vital medical treatments. Our local blood drives are essential in helping replenish the blood supply," said Amber Williams, interim CEO.

Due to the pandemic, the blood drives at SWMC looked different because of social distancing, but our staff took every precaution to keep everyone safe. The donations that were collected went towards saving dozens of people.

"With the blood supply shortage going on right now, I think it is really important to come out and give what I can. If people don't step up and donate as often as they can, then someone, somewhere, may not be able to get any blood if they need it," said Elizabeth Irby, a registered nurse.

SWMC employees donated blood throughout the year, resulting in 162 units of blood that will be distributed to hospitals across the nation, with each pint having the capability of saving up to three lives.

Despite the hardships the COVID pandemic caused for blood drives across the U.S., this marks the 14th blood drive hosted by SWMC.

"SWMC is committed to strengthening our community. This blood drive is our way of giving the community and our staff an opportunity to help save lives," said Amber Williams, interim CEO.

SWMC plans to continue hosting numerous blood drives in the following year. The Red Cross stated there is still a big need for blood. Donors of all blood types are needed, especially those with types O negative, B negative, and A negative. According to the Red Cross, type O negative is the universal blood type that can be safely transfused to anyone and is often used to treat trauma patients. Blood is routinely transfused to patients with cancer and other diseases, premature babies, organ transplant recipients, and trauma victims.

On October 2, 2021, Southwest Medical Center held a health fair, offering critical free and low-cost health screenings. The event was once again a huge success, attracting a large number of community residents who took the opportunity to ask health care questions, receive free health screenings, and learn more about services available locally.

Our annual health fairs reflect our hospital's commitment to promoting wellness through health screenings including blood glucose testing, blood pressure checks, skin cancer screenings, as well as free breast exams.

"Prevention is imperative. We are trying to educate our community that preventive health is the lowest cost health investment you can engage in and it has the highest return on our health. We're trying to make healthcare more accessible every day of the year, through health education and free and low-cost screenings," said Amber Williams, Interim CEO.

As a longtime trusted community provider, Southwest Medical Center makes accessible community health events a priority. Through our annual Community Health Fair and regular screenings in our community, SWMC continues to explore ways to provide Seward County residents with services that optimize the health of the community. Preventative care and wellness education are key ingredients to the early detection and intervention of potentially life-threatening conditions.



### TAKING ON COVID-19

Throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, the staff at SWMC worked diligently day and night to prepare and contribute their absolute best to help slow the spread of the virus across our community. We are proud to say our staff did such a great job our mortality rates during the pandemic were three times below the national average. A part of this was due to our very strong and efficient Hospitalist Program. Dr. Andrey Ilyasov, Director of SWMC's Hospitalist Program, prepared in anticipation of the pandemic. Before Seward County had its first confirmed COVID-19 case, he contacted doctors in New York to come up with his own care plan.

"New York was the epicenter of the coronavirus disease outbreak in the United States. I have friends who are physicians and I was in contact with them from the very beginning. I knew it was a matter of time before it reached Kansas, so I wanted our hospital to be prepared as much as we could," stated Dr. Ilyasov.

On March 20, 2020, Seward County received its first COVID-19 case. Throughout 2020, SWMC admitted more than 582 patients for COVID-19. The SWMC team treated 376 patients throughout 2021. To this day, we have treated more than 1,045 patients hospitalized for COVID-19.

"We are proud to say our mortality rate was three times below the national average. This success comes from a very strong hospitalist program and all of the wonderful dedicated staff. The community is very lucky to have such well-trained and dedicated healthcare professionals. They are all smart, committed, and well-trained. I am so proud to confirm their outstanding performance during the avalanche of COVID-19 patients the hospital accepted," said Dr. Ilyasov.

Dr. Ilyasov, Dr. Chanda, and Dr. Kamath were the team of hospitalist physicians overseeing the care for COVID-19 hospitalizations.

"We took in a lot of very sick patients and were able to help them get better in approximately 5 to 6 days. That was the average stay for patients hospitalized for COVID-19. Our care plan was very effective, and a lot of hospitals across the country started calling us for advice. We were happy to share the care plan, and help other hospitals have the same success. At the end of the day, we are all in this together," said Dr. Ilyasov.

We are almost in the third year of the pandemic. We have learned so much about how to care for patients who come to our hospital with COVID-19. We have safe and effective vaccines, which have been readily available for nearly a full year. We have multiple effective treatments: both monoclonal antibody therapies that have been delivered to many of our patients and although they are currently in short supply newly approved medications.

"Thank you to all the doctors for their hard-work. We have a brilliant team of PAs, dedicated nurses, RTs, and all the other personnel who went above and beyond for our patients," said Dr. Ilyasov.
